What a wonderful venue for our Annual Awards Exhibition and how very fortunate that the Australian Society of Miniature Art Tasmania was again invited to participate in the Clarence Arts Programme, 2017.

The School House Gallery at Rosny hosted 60 interested artists, family members and friends at the Opening on the very warm evening of March 2nd. In the absence of the Mayor, Alderman Deborah Thurley, a member of the Clarence City Council, opened the Exhibition.

A special welcome was extended to the Society Founder, Bernadette Connor O.A.M. and to the Judge, Diane Casimaty, both being presented with shoulder sprays.

The Society President also thanked Sarah Bishop and other staff members at the Gallery, for the excellent hanging of the work and management of the exhibition. Sincere thanks were also extended to the Committee members for their dedication and commitment to the Society and its events.

Prior to the Category Awards being announced, the inaugural Founder's Award was presented. After a short explanation, our Founder presented the award to a very surprised Claire Gill. Claire is a most deserving recipient who not only demonstrates skilful mastery of miniature painting but has participated in the organisation and events within the Society since its inception in 1992.

As 2017 is the 25th Anniversary of the formation of the Society in Tasmania, it was very fitting that our Founder should present the inaugural award which will continue to be presented annually into perpetuity becoming a valued prize. Our sincere thanks to Bernadette for funding the award into the future.

The Vice President thanked the Judge for agreeing to officiate on this occasion, presenting Diane with a gift in appreciation.

The number of entries was slightly down this year but the quality was very high thus the task for the Judge was not easy at times. Sales began early, which was pleasing, and at the time of writing, with 10 days still remaining, 8 have sold with hopes for more to perhaps equal our previous total in 2014 (final total of 13).

- PLEASE always read the entry form in detail several entries could not be accepted this year (in fact 10!) due to frames exceeding the size limit or the painting itself being oversize.
- Always check the work of your framer they do not always "matt" the work evenly and can spoil a good painting.
- Be critical of the standard of your work and width and colour of your frame. Too wide or too heavy in colour can again spoil all your hard work.


